Who & What Is the CRC?

The Commission on Resources and Communications provides guidance and support to congregations and affiliated ministries throughout the Presbytery of Philadelphia in the discernment, development, and sustaining of creative expressions of the gospel. In addition to the management and coordination of grant application and disbursement processes, the CRC also serves as a primary entry point of collaboration for leaders launching new and intentional ministries in their congregations, communities, and beyond.

The Commission consists of twelve members, both ministers and elders, and is staffed by the Associate Presbyter. **CRC** meets at the **Presbytery office on the second Tuesday of each month.** All grant requests are encouraged to be submitted by the last Tuesday of the month to be considered at the next CRC meeting.

What Is a 'New Initiative?' A Working Definition for Ministry Innovators

- A new initiative might be a project built on a bare foundation that seeks to utilize the gifts already present in a community to embody the good news of Jesus Christ in a particular time and place as we address concrete needs, build community, empower leaders, etc.
- A new initiative might also be an advancement to a pre-existing effort that makes a long-standing initiative
 more holistic, expansive, and faithful to what it can mean to be the church in a particular time and place. The
 invitation to dream about new initiatives is an invitation to adapt ministry, guided by the Spirit, to the
 changing community in our pews and the changing world around us as participants in God's mission of
 reconciliation.



The Covenant Fund Grant Program, which launches annually in the spring, uses dollars from restricted funds to spark new initiatives and collaborative ministries that benefit the communities surrounding our churches. Recipients of these grants have birthed new worshipping communities, launched social enterprises, hosted leadership development opportunities, constructed art studios for children, sustained hunger programs, and developed ESL ministries in diverse neighborhoods.
