The Presbytery of Philadelphia held its Stated Meeting at the Oxford Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on Tuesday, January 31, 2023 at 12:47 P.M.

Prior to the meeting, the Presbytery took part in a Pre-Presbytery conversation led by the Committee on Bills and Overtures on the recommended General Assembly Amendments.

The body also enjoyed a time of fellowship and dialogue at lunch.

The Presbytery was called to order at 12:47 P.M. and convened with prayer by the Moderator, Reverend Ted Mingle (Lower Providence).

Following the opening prayer, the body transitioned to worship.

The Presbytery at Worship

During worship, the presbytery heard a sermon from Rev. Dr. Jonathan Walton (8th President of the Princeton Theological Seminary). During worship the Presbytery took part in the Lord's Supper, as well as lifting up those who joined the church triumphant in 2022 (Necrology Report). The body also installed Elders Zandra Maffett (Valley Forge) and Jim Ballengee (Arch Street) as the new Moderator and Vice-Moderator, respectively, of the Presbytery, as well as installation of Reverend Kevin Porter to the office of the Stated Clerk to another 5-year term. The offering collected during worship of \$1,203.00 was collected and dedicated to the new arrivals in Philadelphia Seeking Asylum.

At the conclusion of worship newly installed Moderator Zandra Maffett (Valley Forge) began the business portion of the meeting by calling upon the Rev. Dr. Ethelyn Taylor (Oxford) to give the arrangements and welcome the body.

Moderator Maffett then called upon the Stated Clerk, Rev. Kevin Porter (Presbytery of Philadelphia, Stated Clerk) for his report.

From the **Stated Clerk** (Attachments A & S) Reverend Porter submitted the following:

- Introduced the **Docket** for approval. The **docket was approved by the body as revised.** (see revised docket)
- Introduced the **Consent Agenda** (Attachment A) for approval. The Presbytery **approved the consent agenda as presented**
 - o In addition to the names listed on the consent agenda for necrology, we would like to include the name of Elder Eugene Brown, Cedar Park
 - Included on the consent agenda, the body affirmed the name of the nominees for the Synod positions as listed in the document.
 - o Rev. Porter also reminded the body of the statistal reporting deadline, directing any questions or concerns to Elder Betsi Moise at the Presbytery.
- Introduced 2 Corresponding Members: Rev. Dr. Jonathan Walton (President, Princeton Theological Seminary) Dr. Edward Santana-Grace (San Gabriel). Upon motion and proper second the Presbytery voted to seat them as a Corresponding Members.

Moderator Maffett subsequently called for upon our new Minister members Revs. Dr. John Diller, and David Cagle as well as any first time Elder Commissioners, who were encouraged to message the office of the Stated Clerk to insure they are appropriately welcomed.

• Betty Martin (Chambers), Mac McLarin (Philadelphia, First), and Josef Beck (Warminster, First) Amy Roos (Elkins Park) were welcomed.

At this point Moderator/Vice Moderator Maffett Ballengee called upon Rev. Alex Evangelista (Church on the Mall) to lead the body through Committee on Bills and Overtures.

At the conclusion of his report, Moderator Maffett called upon Elder Julia Hill (Yeadon), chair of the Administrative Commission for the Tully Memorial Presbyterian Church to bring her report.

From the Administrative Commission for the **Tully Memorial Presbyterian Church** (Attachment S)

Elder Hill lifted up the history of the church, as well as the work of the Administrative Commission. At this point, Tully Memorial's current pastor, Rev. Komlan Ezunkpe (Tully) and Member Elder Paula Dixon (Tully) spoke about the church and the 114 year ministry of the church.

At the conclusion of her report and upon motion duly seconded the Presbytery voted to in the affirmative of the following motions:

- 1) That the presbytery affirms the faithful witness of the Tully Memorial Presbyterian Church with gratitude for its over 114 years of faithful witness and service to Christ and approves the dissolution of the Tully Memorial congregation and authorizes the appropriate entities of the Presbytery to resolve any outstanding matters related to the congregation.
- 2) That the Administrative Commission be dismissed with thanks.

At this point Moderator Maffett called upon Rev. Laura Colee (Beacon), chair of the Administrative Commission for the Trinity Presbyterian Church of Kensington to bring her report.

From the Administrative Commission for the **Trinity Presbyterian Church of Kensington** (Attachment S)

Reverend Colee lifted up the history of the church, as well as the work of the Administrative Commission. At this point, Trinity's former pastor, Rev. Thomas Wray (Honorably Retired) spoke about the church and the 162 year ministry of the church.

At the conclusion of her report and upon motion duly seconded the Presbytery voted to in the affirmative of the following motions:

- 1) That the presbytery affirms the faithful witness of the Trinity Presbyterian Church in Kensington with gratitude for it's over a century-long witness and approves the dissolution of the congregation and authorizes the appropriate entities of the Presbytery to resolve any outstanding contractual matters related to the congregation.
- 2) Upon completion of today's vote, the AC is dismissed with thanks.

At the conclusion of both votes, the members of Tully Memorial Presbyterian Church, and Trinity Presbyterian Church of Kensington and their ACs were invited forward and the body participated in a litany of remembrance and thanksgiving for these congregations.

At the conclusion of the prayer, Moderator Maffett called upon Elder Megan Acedo (Beacon) to bring the report of the Committee on Representation.

From the **Committee on Representation** (Attachment U)

During her report, Elder Acedo lifted up the following framing her report through the "space at God's table"

- 92 people who were or are serving on our commissions and committees self-reported this year in the COR report.
- The intentionality of "radical affirmation and human inclusion" and how the presbytery is embodying this through the elected leadership of the presbytery.

At the conclusion of the COR report, Moderator Maffett called upon Elder Ballengee to shepherd the presbytery through the remainder of the meeting.

Vice-Moderator Ballengee called upon Reverend Ted Mingle to bring the report for the Leadership Collegium.

From the **Leadership Collegium** (Attachment L)

He highlighted the following:

• Reverend Mingle lifted up the joining of a coalition on churches and community leaders, which began with the leadership of the Black Clergy of Philadelphia, in response to the gun violence in our Presbytery.

- The continuation of the anti-hate work against antisemitism and islamophobia, as well as other isms
- The spirit of collaboration with our commission leaders and collegium members.

Vice-Moderator Ballengee then called upon the Reverend Ruth Faith Santana-Grace (Presbytery of Philadelphia, Executive Presbyter) for her report.

From the **Executive Presbyter**

During her report, Reverends Santana-Grace, Porter, Sarah Colwill, Brenton Thompson, and Mr. Jim Wagner lifted up the following, framing their comments within transformed to be a transforming presence in the world as we lean into 2023.

- Our 2022 Narrative, showing how clear it is that the Holy Spirit continues to breathe new life into or hearts and minds.
- The Leadership Incubator serving as the overall equipping arm of our ministry together.
- Our ecumenical and denominational partnership which have blessed us over the past year.
- The continuation of leaning into courageous conversations that reflect on healing historically broken relationships.
- Our work addressing the growing challenges in our midst gun violence continues to take center stage within the bounds of our presbytery.
- Our commitment to our church and their leaders has also been embodied in our financial investment and reinvestment of dollars as we faithfully steward our financial resources.

The leadership concluded their report with confetti cannons and a reading of the Romero Prayer.

Seeing as there was no new business, Vice-Moderator Ballengee made a motion, with proper second that was approved to adjourn the meeting with prayer, with the Presbytery reconvening on Tuesday, April 25, 2023.

The meeting was closed with prayer at 4:12 PM.
