The Presbytery of Philadelphia held its online Stated Meeting based out of the Presbytery of Philadelphia Office via Zoom, on Saturday, January 22, 2022 at 10:30 A.M.

Prior to the meeting, Presbytery took part in one virtual Pre-Presbytery gathering to discuss the Overture coming before the Presbytery with the Committee on Bills and Overtures.

A video was shared with the Presbytery, entitled Down to the River by the East Falls Presbyterian Church, with Chior Director Brenda Brovone.

The Presbytery was called to order at 10:32 am and convened with prayer by the Moderator, Reverend Ashley Rossi (Carmel).

## The Presbytery at Worship

During worship, the presbytery heard a sermon on Luke 4:14-21 from **Rev. Dr. Eric D. Barreto**. The Installation of the New Moderator and Vice-Moderator, **Rev. Ted Mingle** (Lower Providence) and **Elder Zandra Maffett** (Vally Forge), as well as a moment to remember the saints of our Presbytery who have joined the church triumphant in the past year also took place during worship. The Lord's supper was presided over by **Revs. Ethelyn Taylor** (Oxford) and **Peter Ahn** (Olivet Covenant). The offering collected during worship of \$ \_\_\_\_\_ was collected and dedicated to the Presbytery's Youth Triennium.

At the conclusion of Worship, newly installed Moderator Rev. Ted Mingle convened the business portion of the meeting, calling upon the Stated Clerk, Rev. Kevin Porter (Presbytery of Philadelphia, Stated Clerk) for his report.

### From the **Stated Clerk**

Reverend Porter submitted the following:

- Rev. Porter called upon Rev. Alex Evangelista (Church on the Mall) to share the virtual arrangements with the body.
- Introduced the **Docket** for approval. The **docket was approved by the body as** amended to include the motion to hear from Co-Moderator of the Denomination, Elona Street-Stewart.
- Introduced the **Consent Agenda** (Attachment A) for approval. The Presbytery **approved the consent agenda as presented.** Highlights include:
  - The necrology report of the saints of our Presbytery who have joined the church triumphant. If there were any omissions please contact the Office of the Stated Clerk
  - Reverend Porter also lifted up the many installations and ordinations that happened since the Presbytery gathered last.
- Introduced 1 Corresponding Member: Elder Elona Street-Stewart (Co-Moderator of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Upon motion and proper second the Presbytery voted to seat them as Corresponding Member.

Moderator Mingle subsequently called for upon our new Minister member Rev. Isaac Baah as well as any first time Elder Commissioners to message the office of the Stated Clerk to insure they are appropriately welcomed.

## From the **Committee on Bills and Overtures** (Attachment B)

Reverend Porter then called upon Elder Eck Gerner (Swarthmore) to present on behalf of the Committee on Bills and Overtures.

- Elder Gerner shared an Overture coming before the Presbytery for the 225<sup>th</sup> General Assembly regarding Harassment
- Elder Gerner, on behalf of the Committee on Bills and Overtures, presented the motion to approve the overture to the 225<sup>th</sup> General Assembly. Upon second, and proper discussion, the presbytery voted to approve the overture as presented.

## From the **Leadership Collegium** (Attachment L)

At the conclusion of his report, Moderator Mingle called upon former Moderator Rossi to share the Leadership Collegium Report. She highlighted the following:

- Reverend Rossi then called upon Reverend Lori Kosinski (Norriton) to give a report on behalf of the Administrative Commission on for the Kirkwood Camp. (Stated Clerks Report, Page 37) The Presbytery heard a report from Reverend Kosinski and made the following motions which upon proper second, and discussion, were approved as presented. The Presbytery also voted to approve the dissolution of the Administrative Commission with gratitude for their service.
  - The Presbytery of Philadelphia Pay all outstanding bills and restore all incurred expenses prior to the sale for Kirkwood Camp maintenance and repair to the Presbytery budget from the proceeds of the sale as appropriate up to \$125,000.
  - O Pursue an ongoing relationship with Johnsonburg Camp and Retreat Center inclusive of having Presbytery of Philadelphia representation on its Board of Directors. As such, the Presbytery of Philadelphia would encourage congregations to participate in the many opportunities available at Johnsonburg, including but not limited to summer camping, retreat opportunities and program support resources. The relationship will include but not be limited to:
    - Providing a one-time gift of \$150,000 from the proceeds of the Kirkwood Camp's sale to be contributed to the current Johnsburg Capital Fund campaign.
    - That the Presbytery of Philadelphia's on-going annual budget reflect its commitment to Camping Ministry with a line item of \$15,000 to be donated to Johnsonburg Camp and Retreat Center.
    - That the Johnsonburg Camp and Retreat Center be the recommended designated recipient of the income from the Smyrl Fund that is currently held with the Presbyterian Foundation and had been designated to Kirkwood Camp.
  - Provide a one-time gift of \$50,000 to Mid-Atlantic Regional Lenape people's children and youth ministry to be selected in consultation with current PC(USA) Co-Moderator Elona Street-Stewart that reflects our acknowledgement of the Lenape indigenous people's initial ownership and stewardship of the Kirkwood Camp properties.
    - That the remaining balance of the net proceeds be placed with New Covenant Trust Company (NCTC) for investment in the newly created

Camp Kirkwood Fund with following recommendations:

- Up to 4% of the Camp Kirkwood Fund will be available for the Presbytery of Philadelphia's ministry for Christian formation primarily for children and youth through Presbyterian camping, conferences and other creative ministries. \* Up to 4% of the market value of the Camp Kirkwood Fund account balance, based on a three year rolling average with measure taken at the end of each third quarter, be available annually for the Presbytery of Philadelphia's Ministry for Christian formation primarily for children and youth through Presbyterian Camping Conferences, and other creative ministires.
- That the Camp Kirkwood Fund distribution be under the oversight of the Commission on Resources and Creative Ministries and that a report on number of scholarships be made annually to the Presbytery.
- The Investment Policy Statement and the oversite of the Camp Kirkwood Fund be under the Board of Trustees.
  - That the principle be protected for income to be made available in perpetuity and will not be spent down without consultation with the Leadership Collegium and recommendation to the Presbytery by its Board of Trustees. (For example, to be used for Presbytery-wide youth initiatives, and additional Presbyterian camping capital campaigns or additional Presbytery resources.)
  - That NCTC will invest these funds in a socially responsible manner with preference to align with the General Assembly's Mission Responsibility Through Investment that forbid investing in areas related to tobacco, guns, human trafficking, etc. This will allow for investment of Kirkwood Camp's net sale proceeds that will be used to raise funds for ministry and to support the Presbytery of Philadelphia's mission goals to support global care of God's creation and all peoples.
- o The dissolution of the Administrative Commission for the Kirkwood Camp, with gratitude for their service.
- At the conclusion of the Administrative Commission's report, the Presbytery greeted director of the Johnsonburg Camp and Conference Center, as well as heard some words of encouragement from Elder Elona Street-Stewart.
- Reverend Carla Jones Brown (Arch Street), was called upon to give a brief update on the Personnel of the Presbytery, welcoming our new legal counsel, as well as the Reverends Larrissa Kwong Abazia (Presbytery of the Coastlands), and Dr. Janel Dixon (Cedar Park) who have begun supporting the work of the Vital Congregations and Cultivating Enough in the Care of Clergy Initiatives. Reverend Brown also answered several questions regarding the resignation of Reverend Greg Klimovitz, as well as a moment of appreciation for the work he did during his tenure.

At the conclusion of her report, Vice Moderator Maffett assumed the chair, called upon Elder Megan D. Acedo (Beacon) to give the report of the Committee on Representation.

## From the **Committee on Representation (COR)** (Attachment R)

During her report, Elder Acedo lifted up the following:

- Thanked the commissioners and committee members for 100% participation in the COR surveys.
- Most of the Presbyter's committees and commissions met online via zoom during 2021
- There is always a chair at God's table for all of us, sharing the symbol of a chair as God's expanding table
- The Presbytery is making progress, although there is more work do to as there is still underrepresentation with only 15% of our commissions and committee members being 25 years and younger.

At the conclusion of her report, Elder Maffett called upon Reverend Ruth Faith Santana-Grace (Presbytery of Philadelphia, Executive Presbyter) for her report.

## From the **Executive Presbyter**

During her report, Reverend Santana-Grace lifted up the following:

- Reverend Todd Stavrakos (Gladwyne) was called forward to share information about our Presbytery's Self Development of People (SDoP) Awards for this year.
  - Michelle Simmons from the Why Not Prosper, and Gene Burke from The Common Place Community Garden were awarded funds this year for their work
- Rev. Santana-Grace framed her comments encouraging the assembly to lean into the hope we've been granted because of our faith in Christ.

The Presbytery was then broken into small groups for a period of time for fellowship and connection.

When the presbytery was brought back together, Elder Maffett turned the chair back to Moderator Mingle.

Seeing as there was no new business, Moderator Mingle made a motion, with proper second that was approved to adjourn the meeting with prayer.
